PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE



November 12, 2025

Dear CK Community:

We wanted to take a moment to update you on the financial position of Christ the King School at this time. We know there is a need for transparency on how money is spent in the church and school, and how families can contribute toward specific needs. Thanks to the Parental Choice Tax Credit, the church subsidy has been reduced from \$845,000 during the 2023/24 school year to \$196,000 currently. While the tax credit has been a huge help to the school and church, without the church's absorption of school expenses, the school would still be in the red. The church, and specifically the offertory collection, keeps the lights on, pays salaries, and facilitates all ongoing operations. School tuition does not cover all of these expenses, so the church absorbs these costs, keeping the school afloat and tuition at a reasonable level. It should be noted that offertory collection has taken a downtum over the past few years. Therefore, your consistent offertory contribution, which designates you as an Active Parishioner, is extremely important to the financial health of our school and parish.

PTO Wish List:

The CK Wish List is an annual list that allows parents, faculty, and administration to contribute ideas for needs for the school next year. PTO fundraisers including the CK Run, Auction, and Golf Tournament are pooled together to satisfy these needs and contribute toward bettering the school experience for students. There are certain parameters for the Wish List funds: they cannot be used to fund school operations, consistent school needs, nor salaries. The Wish List consists of programs, materials and items that give CK a competitive edge and make it the school it is. Please see the attached document, which outlines how a portion of last year's PTO funds were spent.

Annual Fund:

The Annual Fund, which specifically supports the school, has more specific financial targets. Historically, the PTO has generously chosen to support the Annual Fund through the Wish List (\$50,000). The Annual Fund helps to financially grow the Education Endowment, which provides financial assistance for tuition. The School Endowment helps to meet needs that may arise in the school including instructional support (classroom aides), technology needs, safety improvements, supplemental resources, campus improvements, and additional compensation to help with teacher retention. Christ the King School receives 4% each year from the Endowment principal to use as specified. If donations to the Annual Fund are marked as "unrestricted," those dollars are not included in the School Endowment, and can be used immediately and for the same purposes as the School Endowment. While giving to the Annual Fund is encouraged, the offertory should take precedence over this fund as the offertory facilitates daily function and operation of the school.

Expenses:

CK recently applied for a Security Grant through the Department of Homeland Security. Within the grant, which would award \$200,000 to school AND church (each), we requested upgraded bullet resistant glass, improved access control systems, and additional cameras around the campus to cover current blind spots. We have already moved forward with securing weapon-detection technology that pairs with our existing cameras. This cost (\$16,000) will be partially paid for by the live appeal held during the auction and supplemented by the school and church. The school is also in need of an updated intercom system with improved capabilities that reach MDO, the basement, and outdoor areas. We are using One Church, Many Disciples monies to fund this effort (\$60,000), which we aim to complete over the summer.

Salaries remain the highest expense for the school, and we are getting closer to matching OKCPS salary scales. Recruitment and retention of quality educators is a top priority, especially considering the massive teacher shortage that exists in this state. Fewer people are going into the field, education departments are shrinking, and Oklahoma has trouble competing with surrounding states' teacher salaries. Christ the King needs to do everything it can to remain competitive and seek out the best and brightest around. All research supports that the teacher is the single most significant factor for student success.

Preschool Expansion:

As you may recall, we have had a significant demand for our preschool program. For the past several years, we have not been able to accommodate all parishioners wishing to join the school. In fact, we have had to turn away a full class of preschoolers over the past two years. We are looking to expand our preschool program to respond to our parishioners wishing to join Christ the King School and give their kids the opportunity of a Catholic education. The school & church are conducting a feasibility study to view our options for creating more space & addressing the needs of the school & church. We will provide more details in the future as this expansion plan develops.

Accreditation Survey:

Financial Data:

We hope the attached charts and graphics help to illustrate expenses and income for Christ the King School. Please note that some expenses are placed under headings that encompass a wide variety of items. Building and grounds not only includes landscaping costs, but also improvements and general maintenance to the campus and buildings. For example, we replaced 11 HVAC systems last year and we maintain 75 units on this campus. We know that as members of a Catholic parish, the giving of time, treasure and talent is part of our commitment to God. We are grateful for your continued generosity to this wonderful school and parish. Please feel free to reach out with any questions. Thank you.


PTO DOLLARS in action

Our parents and faculty are dedicated to fostering both the spiritual and academic excellence of CTK students. Thanks to your generous support of PTO events, we can finance several items from our annual 'Wish List.' This list has been created based on recommendations from both teachers and parents to address the school's needs. While these are just a few of the additions, this year's PTO Wish List amounted to \$280,615, which was carefully invested in strategic initiatives, campus enhancements, and academic resources that ensure our school remains forward-thinking and uphold its commitment to excellence.


- New chromebooks for 4th & 5th graders to use for research, testing, etc., as well as an additional charging station. **(\$42,275)**
- Four new interactive smart boards that allow teachers and students to write, draw, and engage with digital lessons using touch or special pens. (\$7,500)
- Variety of items for Preschool such as Learning without Tears program, light table, manipulatives for math and literacy, dramatic play items, STEAM materials, and more. (\$10,850)
- Books for all reading levels, various new flexible seating, a new technology space, lighting and bright and cheerful rugs and decor have given the library a fresh and inviting look. (\$21,000)
- Subscription to Minecraft for Education which allows students to learn about coding and computer science. A subscription to Soundtrap which enables students to create sound recordings for various subjects, transforming them into songs and podcasts. This fosters creativity, original compositions, and collaboration among classmates. (\$1,600)
- A soft hockey floor pack and a 9 square in the air game have been incorporated into our Physical Education curriculum. (\$1,300)
- New resources have been introduced to enhance the SOAR program, including; new learning materials, alternative seating, dyslexic-friendly books, games and other supportive items. Additionally, a new buzzer system was purchased for the academic team. (\$4,960)
- Materials for the Science lab such as electric scales, frog dissection charts, Pangea activity maps and cutters, to name a few. (\$1,055)
- Drama/Arts Programs: A new modular flooring, recurring expenses for lighting, sound, costumes, licensing fees and royalties, and more. (\$8,000)
- The "Catechists's Husband" and "The Mustard Seed" were purchased to assist in creating new Montessori Catechesis of the Good Shephard classrooms, which serve Prek 2nd grade. (\$2,500)
- FACTS Admissions, Enrollment and soon to come Family App. (\$5,900)


