- baseball pants, rolled up slacks, cut off or pulled up sweats. Pants should hit right below the knee.
- Long socks or tights to cover their legs.
- A long button down shirt with a belt or sash around the waist.
- Sandals (NOT flip-flops) for peasants, brown or black shoes, or slippers for nobility and the wealthy.


GIRLS

- Long skirts, ankle length for nobility, at least past the knee for all others
- Peasant blouses
- Ballet flats, or flat shoes of some type. No high heels please.
- All junior high students will be provided with costume pieces from the Drama Department.

ALL

- Lunch will be as regularly scheduled. The concession booth will have fruits and cookies, brownies, etc.. available for purchase during the students' carnival time.
- How much money should you expect to bring? It's up to you! Prices for the games and craft booths range from \$.50–2.00. Tickets are 2 for \$1.
